#### Dear Friends

Production of Barrow News is the result of the Herculean labours of a small band of volunteers who contribute articles, edit content, format content, watch the printer for hours, and distribute the magazines. A huge "thank you" to them all, and also to our advertisers for their support. I would also like to thank everyone who has made a donation to cover the costs of production, all of which fall ultimately upon the congregation at the church. If you have not done so already, please do give what you can!

This month's edition of Barrow News will no doubt be dropping through your

letterbox on or around 1<sup>st</sup> April, otherwise known (in this country at least) as April Fool's Day, or April Fish Day in some countries. The origin of the day is not that clear and it would seem to be a relatively recent invention, to have a day (or morning at least) where playing tricks on just about anyone is considered fair game. There have been some classic "April Fool's" over the years, particularly before the advent of social media, when whatever the BBC in particular said was gospel. The spaghetti-tree story was a three-minute hoax report broadcast on April Fools' Day 1957 by the BBC showing a family in Switzerland harvesting spaghetti from the family "spaghetti tree". Believe it or not, a large number of viewers afterwards contacted the BBC for advice on growing their own spaghetti trees. The broadcast remains one of the biggest hoaxes ever pulled by any reputable news source.

To some, the truth around the celebration of Easter Sunday by Christians is a hoax of considerably greater proportions. Ironically, Easter Sunday last fell on April 1<sup>st</sup> in 1956, and it will do so again in 2029 and 2040. Surely the story of Jesus being executed on a cross, being buried and then being seen alive by hundreds of people days later is one of the most enduring hoaxes ever perpetrated. Well, I, and billions like me, think it is all true and as my desk diary Bible verse for today says "The message of the cross...to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (From Paul's letter to the Corinthians 1:18). Life looks and feels very different as a result.

Happy Easter holidays to everyone. I hope you weren't taken in by this year's equivalent of the spaghetti tree!

# Minutes of Barrow Parish Council meeting held on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> February 2024 at Barrow Village Hall

#### **Approval of Minutes:**

The circulated minutes of the Parish Council meeting on 8 January 2024 were approved & signed by the Chair

#### Matters Arising - If not covered by agenda:

- AP fed back that he had verbal communication from Katie Jones (KJ) that she
  had sent in her resignation due to personal commitments. Councillors
  expressed their gratitude for the hard work she had done for the council.
- Correspondence from a landscape contractor regarding grass cutting. As
  KJ has left the council the Clerk TW will be asked to follow this up, including
  quotation for Norman's Wood strimming.
- Planning proposals- Barrowmore. Councillors attended a meeting on 15<sup>th</sup>
  January to hear Barrowmore's ideas for resubmitting planning proposals for
  the Brownfield site. Correspondence was received from one of the trustees
  thanking councillors for attending.

#### Correspondence - Unless covered as an agenda item:

- TW received correspondence from Barrow School enquiring about responsibility for a Scots Pine tree in the school car park whose roots are causing some damage. A response has been sent explaining that this is not the Responsibility of the Parish Council. JT explained that she is Chair of the Governors and was not involved in the decision to send the letter.
- AP received correspondence from a resident expressing concern about the forthcoming closures of the A51 and the impact this may have on traffic through the village, especially HGV lorries. It was noted that there is a 7.5 tonne limit on vehicles passing over the bridge over Meadow Brook on Station Lane, but lorries had limited opportunity to turn around.
