Dear Friends,

I was in school the other day, leading Collective Worship on the topic of Lent, for that is the church season that runs from Ash Wednesday to Easter. By tradition it is forty days long, reflecting the time that Jesus spent in the wilderness being tested and tempted, and over the years other traditions have grown up around it. As a bit of fun, I was asking the children some "Lent Trivia" questions, most of which they got absolutely right, leaving me very impressed indeed. I kept one harder question up my sleeve, "what word is traditionally not said during Lent in some churches?" Hands shot up and the first answer I received was "swear words", a brilliant answer, but not exactly the one I was looking for. Tradition in some churches results in the word "Hallelujah" being omitted from all liturgy until Easter Sunday when the service opens with the words "He is risen, Hallelujah, Hallelujah", and the people respond with "He is risen indeed, Hallelujah, Hallelujah". The word is one that defies translation, a sort of spontaneous out-pouring of joy.

Lent is a time of waiting, a time of reflecting upon our own shortcomings and our relationship with God. Some will give up something for Lent in order to stand alongside Jesus in the wilderness, resisting temptation and thereby feeling a little closer to Him. I have to confess that I am not that good at waiting or reflecting, so Lent is a good time for me to practice both! Signs of new life are all around us as the blossom bursts out and flowers become ever more colourful. It sometimes feels like nature itself is holding its breath until it can join with us to celebrate new life, new beginnings and new hope. For Christians, Easter Day is the ultimate celebration of new life, the time when death itself is defeated once and for all. Do join us. A warm welcome awaits as we can say "Hallelujah" together.

Question 4


