#### Dear Friends

On 6th May 1954, the runner Roger Bannister easily won the mile race at Ifley Road track, Oxford, but as he crossed the finish line the large crowd on that early evening were brimming with excitement and anticipation. The question was how quickly he had won. The race official, with pipe in mouth and stopwatch in hand, let the tension build before declaring, "Three minutes...", at which point the rest was drowned out by cheering. Bannister had achieved a physical feat never done before, despite the attempts of numerous athletes, running a mile in under four minutes. His actual time was 3 minutes, 59.4 seconds.

The current world record holders for a mile are Hicham El Guerrouj of Morocco in 3:43.13 and Faith Kipyegon of Kenya who holds the Women's record of 4:07.64. Watching the London Marathon recently, I was amazed to read that elite athletes maintain a pace of between 4 and 5 miles per hour for the full distance of over 26 miles. It won't be long before someone breaks the two-hour barrier.

Running races have been with us for thousands of years, with the first recorded event being held in Egypt in 3,800 BC, although it was only over a mere 800 metres! Nevertheless, it is no wonder that Biblical writers such as the Apostle Paul should use running as an illustration for the Christian life. In his letter to a young church in Corinth, he encourages them to keep going with the words "You've all been to the stadium and seen the athletes race. Everyone runs; one wins. Run to win. All good athletes train hard. They do it for a gold medal that tarnishes and fades. You're after one that's gold eternally." (From a modern translation, The Message Bible)

In the 2024 London Marathon, a record total of over 50,000 runners took part in the event, representing 158 nations. They of course did not all expect to win, but they nevertheless trained hard for months and months as though they were. That is the point St Paul is making. Having faith is a lifelong marathon, so we need to keep on going whatever the headwind, whatever the weather and to keep going through the wall. If we have stopped and rested for years, it doesn't matter, we just need to get back and place one foot in front of the other. That medal will still be there!

2. TW has enquired to see if temporary 7.5 tone signs can be placed at entrance to Station Lane at Chester Road end and by Stamford Bridge before the Landsdowne Road turn off, has been informed this will be actioned.

3. TW requested to contact highways regarding the damaged chevron signage at Plemstall View

## Village Noticeboards:

1. AP has not checked the redundant notice boards yet for removal. WIP

2. The Footpath committee noticeboard is rotten, PR to ask the village hall committee if the PC can put one of the redundant notice boards on VH Land for use by the PC and the Footpath Committee.

Working Groups & Sub Committees – updates: Flood Group. Unfortunately, Barrow have not been successful in the grant from National Flood
Management. Have had a meeting with EA and are looking at other sources of funding. Footpath's Committee AP and JW attended a meeting with newly appointed CWaC Footpath's Officer for Barrow, Mike Goan, which they feel was very positive. TW queried the footpath committee accounts, as they do not agree with the PC accounts TW given a contact to follow this up with.
BPPFF – update: Unfortunately making slow progress on grants for new playground equipment. The Pavilion is in need of more usage.


